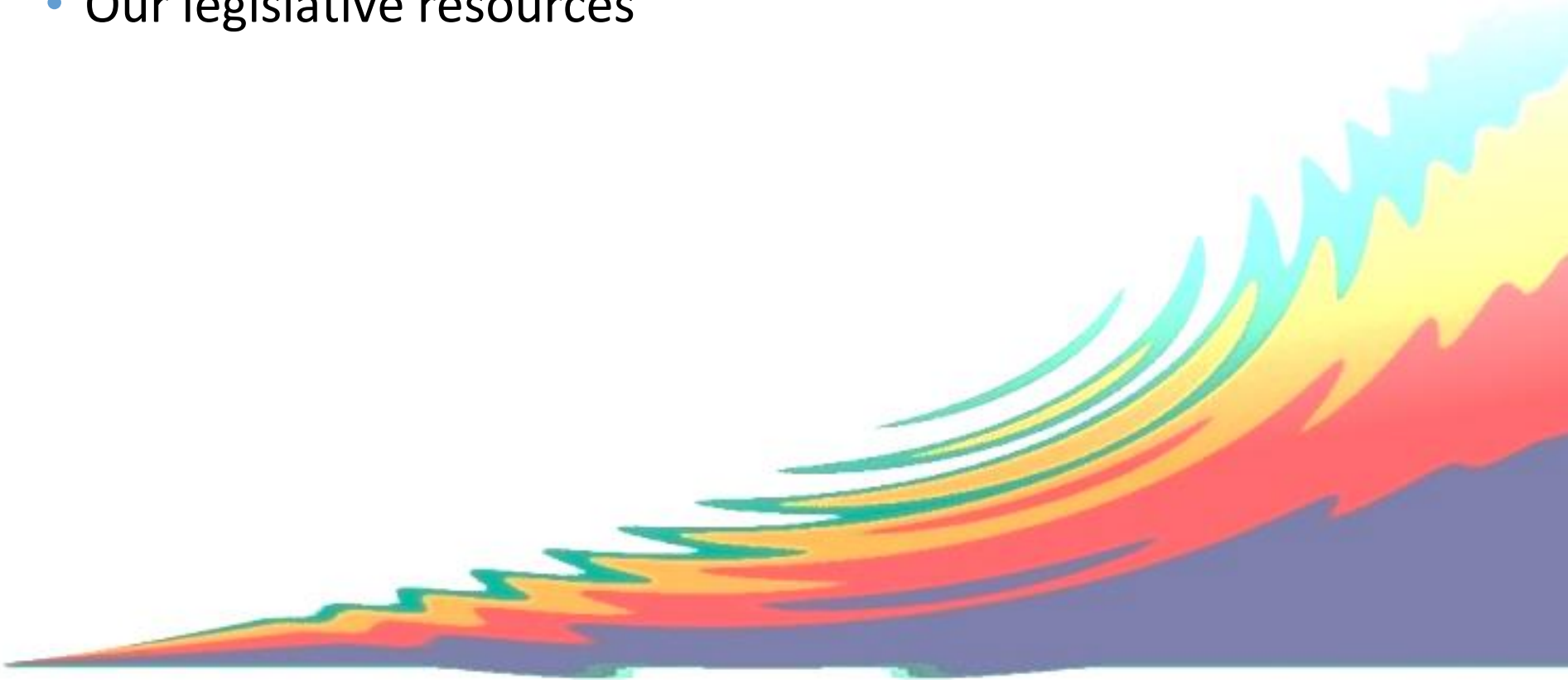

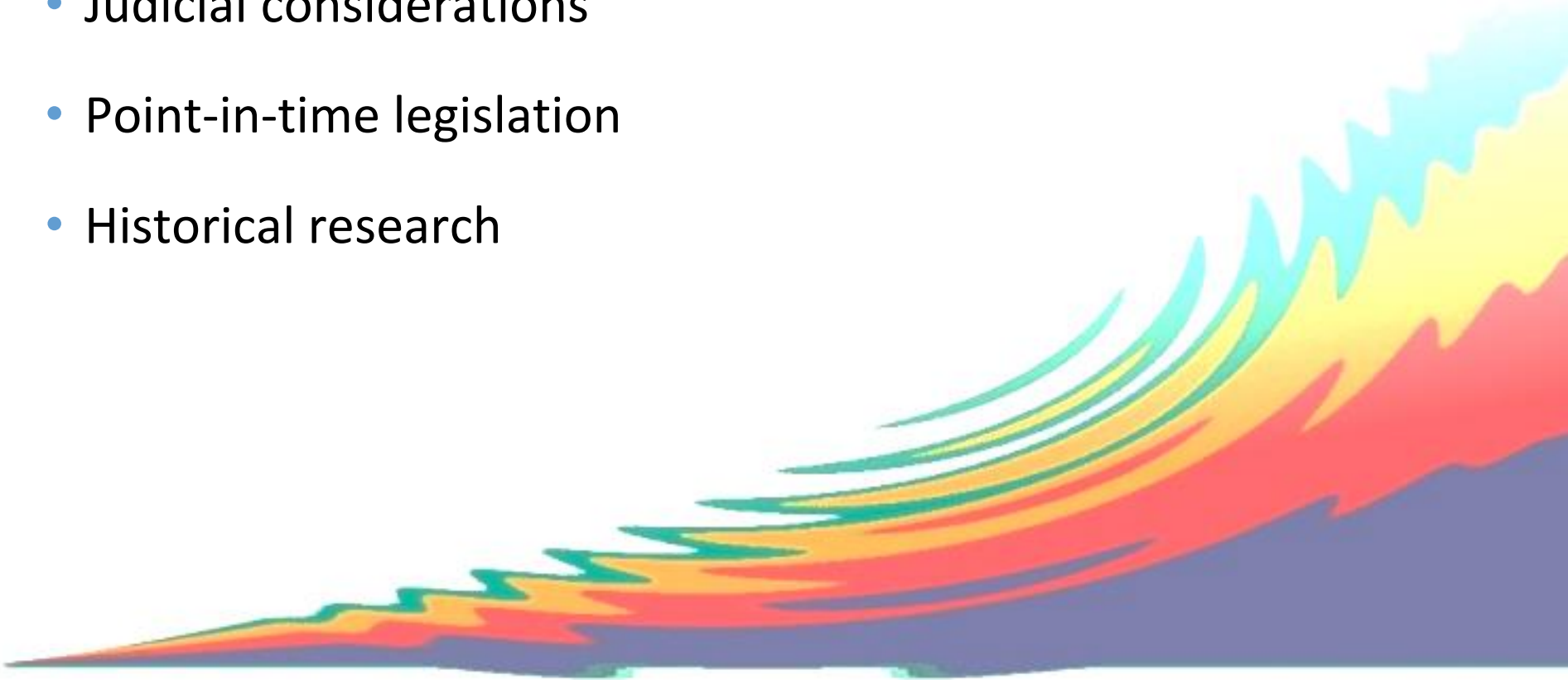

  - A searchable database
  - Indexes all bills introduced in the Saskatchewan Legislature since 1993
  - Each bill is analyzed for its effect on existing legislation
  - Organized by acts, not bills – a record is added when an act is amended or created



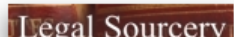



    - Includes information gathered from the Legislative Assembly, Publications Saskatchewan, and Government Legislative Services
    - When the Legislature is in session, the database is updated weekly; when not in session, it is updated when proclamations for Acts are received
    - A compilation of three sources of information that can save you time and effort

### Legislative Summary (from Justice Update):

Sections 2-1, 2-3, 2-18, 2-20, 2-40, 2-46, 2-55, 2-58, 2-85, 2-93, 2-95, 6-1, 6-19, 6-34, 6-36, 6-39, 6-59, 6-62, 6-67, 6-88, 6-91 and 6-105 amended on Third Reading. New sections 1-4, 2-56 to 2-58, 2-60 and 10-31 added on Third Reading. Section 6-18 was defeated on Third Reading. This Act combines and updates 12 pieces of legislation into a single Act dealing with all aspects of labour and employment. Some changes to existing legislation include: provisions that deal with the designation of a prime contractor which will ensure that on construction sites with multiple contractors, one contractor has overall responsibility for the entire construction site; the creation of additional unpaid leaves for organ donation; attending a citizenship ceremony; crime-related child death or disappearance; and critically ill child care removing the ability for the ministry to grant a special permit for people with disabilities to be paid a lower wage; allowing for the provision of four 10-hour shifts while maintaining the 40-hour work week; requiring employees to give employers two weeks' notice of resignation; requiring unions to provide audited financial statements and the results of votes to their members; clarifying the definition of supervisory employees; removing the legislative authority that deems fines imposed by unions on members to be a debt that can be collected through the civil court process; allowing for decertification of a union that has been inactive for three years; providing for appeals to the Labour Relations Board from decisions of Occupational Health and Safety Adjudicators and Labour Standards Adjudicators. This Act will come into force on proclamation.

### Legislative Summary (from Justice Update):

This Act makes amendments to The Income Tax Act, 2000, including: reducing the personal income tax rates for all individuals, as well as trusts, beginning in the 2017 taxation year, with further reductions implemented through to the 2020 taxation year; reducing the general corporate income tax rate beginning on July 1, 2017, with further reductions coming into effect on July 1, 2019; eliminating the education and tuition tax credits effective July 1, 2017, while continuing to allow unused amounts carried forward from previous taxation years to be used; reducing the dividend tax credit rate for eligible dividends beginning in the 2017 taxation year, with further reductions implemented through to the 2020 taxation year, to realign with the reduction in the general corporate income tax rate; enhancing the low-income tax credit; suspending the annual indexation of the personal income tax system starting in the 2018 taxation year; implementing a four year phasing out of a special tax reduction available to Saskatchewan credit unions, beginning in 2017; increasing the refundable manufacturing and processing investment tax credit (M&P ITC) on new and used equipment from five per cent to six per cent, to maintain the notation linkage between the M&P ITC and PST rates; implementing a refundable component to the research and development (R&D) tax credit for Canadian-controlled private corporations, and a revised R&D tax credit for all corporations; updating provisions respecting the corporate rental housing rebate; implementing administrative provisions respecting a new commercial innovation incentive that will allow corporations to claim a Saskatchewan commercial innovation incentive tax rebate in accordance with The Saskatchewan Commercial Innovation Incentive (Patent Box) Act; and making other technical amendments required to various sections of the Act in order to properly legislate tax reductions and to update incentive references found in other sections of the Act. **Legislative Summary (from Justice Update):**

The Act was amended to: provide the Saskatchewan Real Estate Commission and the Superintendent of Real Estate with authority to share information with other regulators, law enforcement agencies and other real estate commissions; authorize the Commission to enter into agreements with other regulators; allow the Superintendent to appoint representatives to carry out the responsibilities imposed on the Superintendent pursuant to the Act; allow regulations to be made requiring brokerages and salespersons to carry errors and omissions insurance coverage in minimum amounts and from a specified carrier; allow the Commission to **enact bylaws relating to the disclosure of information** by registrants; and extend the time for the Commission to prepare and file its annual report with respect to the Real Estate Assurance Fund with the Minister.

*An Act to amend *The Real Estate Act**

(Assented to July 10, 2002)

HER MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows:

**Short title**

**1** This Act may be cited as *The Real Estate Amendment Act, 2002*.

**Legislative Summary (from Justice Update):**

This Act provides for the province to establish a 10% tax credit applied to flow-through share purchases that may be claimed by the purchaser under The Income Tax Act or The Income Tax Act, 2000. This credit and before January 1, 2004. The provincial tax credit will only apply to specific mineral exploration activities carried out in Saskatchewan for investors paying Saskatchewan income tax. The Act authorizes regulations necessary to the operation of the tax credit program.
